GOING TO THE TRIAL GARDEN NEXT SPRING

The season is just about over for growing dahlias but the work is not over yet. Those growers that dig their tubers every year, that part of the season is just beginning. I have had a number of growers ask me over years why I dig my dahlias every year instead of every 2-3 years. There are a number of reasons for digging every year and I would like to discuss a few of them.

1. Protection From Freezing—I remember the winter of 1984 when the temperature reached –8 degrees in December of that year. I had a few tubers still in the ground and not all of them froze. I realize we won't get that cold usually but it is nice to know they won't freeze if they are in a cool/cold location <u>inside</u>. That brings up another issue of how to store your tubers inside. The best way to store tubers, in my opinion, is to store in plastic grocery bags in boxes. If you are leaving them all winter (I cut mine all winter) then the addition of coarse vermiculite, not regular vermiculite, in each bag. This

will keep the transfer of moisture at the proper lever so they will not shrivel or rot. But, you need to check stored tubers every month they are in storage as the previous statement is not 100% accurate and you need to get the rotted tubers out of the bags so others in the bag don't rot.

- 2. Tubers for the Tuber Sale—We are only going to have one tuber sale in 2019. We are hoping to have it in the first two weeks of May so it won't be so late in May after planting has already started. We will need all of the tubers we can get for that sale so those that usually don't bring tubers we will need them for this sale as I would expect 50+ people in attendance.
- 3. I am too Busy in the Spring to Dig Tubers—Growing seedlings and cuttings takes up a lot of my time in the Spring so I must have my tubers ready to go so I prioritize my digging during the winter so I can process those I want to start under lights. I know most members don't do this but with all of the plants and tubers I give away I must start early.

NOVEMBER MEETING

This month's meeting will be held on Saturday, November 17th, at 11:00 AM in the Turner Theater, in the Atlanta Botanical Garden Entrance Building. The program will be a discussion about winter care of your dahlias and will include a demonstration of how to cut your tubers. There will be hands-on dividing of tubers by attendees.

NOT DIGGING YOUR DALIAS THIS WINTER?

- 1. Make sure you cut off your stalks down to about 6".
- 2. Put a cap of tinfoil on each stalk and secure with a rubber band. This keeps the crown (this is where the eyes are) from rotting.
- 3. Tag each plant with the name and description (A-FD-OR) of the plant. If you don't know the name make sure you have a description of some sort. Make a map of the plants.
- 4. Put about 6" of leaves, pine straw, mulch of some sort or anything you have to keep the tubers from freezing.
